

**SPECIAL CALLED MEETING OF THE ALAMO MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN**

**MONDAY, DECEMBER 16, 2019 AT 5:30 P.M. AT CITY HALL**

Mayor Emison called the meeting to order.

Roll was called with the following Aldermen present: John Reddick, P.B. Conley, and Larry Conder, Kenneth Bodkins

**New Business**

The Mayor called on Chief of Police Brad York to update the Board and public on the door knocking events. Chief York stated that there have been several reports of the door knockings, with possible shots fired in the East Main St area. This issue has been solved but because it is a juvenile a name cannot be released. Mayor Emison had asked about the Town putting up reward money and Chief York advised against it stating that to do that it had to be misdemeanor crimes committed in police presence. And you have to make an arrest and that cannot be done unless it occurred in police presence. The auto burglaries are not solved at this time but they do currently have names on this incident. Chief York had spoken with Capt. Spraggins with the CCSD and believe some of the confusion with the lights are possibly officers with flashlights going into yards and using spot lights. He has narrowed down the shots fired to a vehicle that came down East Park St and also N Cavalier Drive Saturday night. Its believed to be a small black car with a loud muffler that when it accelerates and decelerates it sounds like gun fire. They have found no other evidence to confirm actual shots fired at this time.

Alderman Bodkins wants to know if we had any more applicants in for the Police Officer position. Chief York stated we had several, and one certified applicant that would make a good officer. Alderman Reddick inquired would this person be willing to move to Crockett. York is unsure if he would be willing to. Ann Strong inquired if you had to live in Crockett County and it is not in the Charter but a proximity requirement is.

Resolution 2019-15 A Resolution of the Town of Alamo Board of Mayor and Aldermen authorizing the present distribution formula of Local Option Sales Tax for four years. Jordan Spraggins stated that he agrees with Mayor Gary Reasons and that the resolution meets the motion he made at the School Board meeting and wants to continue to work together. Reecha Black stated that 2024/2025 is their deadline to satisfy their debt. Alderman Conley made a motion to adopt, Alderman Bodkins second the motion. All Ayes motion carried.

With no further business before the Board Alderman Conley made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Alderman Reddick. Motion carried.
