

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE
ALAMO MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN
MONDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2022 AT 5:00 P.M. AT CITY HALL
97 SOUTH JOHNSON STREET, ALAMO, TENNESSEE, 38001**

Mayor Emison called the meeting to order.

Roll was called with the following Aldermen present: P.B. Conley, Jim Knox, Michael Moore and John Reddick.

Invocation was given by Mayor Emison

Others present: Amanda Harris, Ferris Arnold, Chief Jeff Sills, Chris Davis.

A motion was made by Alderman Conley to accept the minutes of the January 10, 2022 meeting and Alderman Knox seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted, Aye.

The Mayor's comments this month started with an update on the history project the Cemetery Committee is working on to map and mark the Negro Cemetery in the Alamo Cemetery. The town would like to thank Harvey Bradshaw for keeping the storm shelter open in December for almost 13 hours when we had bad weather. Well #2 is now back in service and working properly. NPDES permit application has been resubmitted to the State. Martin Paving has committed to come back and fix all the patches that are subpar from the paving job. They will be back out once their shop opens back up this spring. The TOSHA audit was conducted and we had a few findings that will be addressed and our answer will be filed with TOSHA showing completion of addressing their findings. We have acquired the ambulance from the County and will begin converting it for the Fire Department use. The Interlocal Agreement Order for the nine properties that did not sell in the tax sale was signed by the judge on January 5, 2022. The pre-construction conference is Wednesday February 9, 2022 for the sewer infrastructure project we are about to begin. Fire Chief Neal Towater has resigned as of the end of February and we will be looking for a new Chief for the position. We have had delays in the audit. Kay Stigal with MTAS will be here to help resolve the issues in order to get the audit completed soon.

First reading of an Ordinance Amending Title 18 of the Alamo Municipal Code, Chapter Three (Water) and Chapter Six (Sewer Use) was read. Alderman Conley made the motion to approve this ordinance. Alderman Knox seconded the motion. All aldermen voted yes. Motion passed.

Old business in discussion was the playground equipment quotes. An estimated quote of \$83,349 for new equipment at both parks in town was presented. After further discussion this was passed for a future date to be announced.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned.
