

REGULAR MEETING OF THE ALAMO MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN

MONDAY, JANUARY 7, 2018 AT 5:00 P.M. AT CITY HALL

Mayor Emison called the meeting to order.

Roll was called with the following Aldermen present: Larry Conder, P. B. Conley and John Reddick. Kenneth Bodkins was absent.

Mayor Emison gave the invocation.

Others present: Rita Reasons, Jim Knox, Neal Towater, John Gorman and Ferris Arnold.

Mayor Emison gave his monthly report on the following items: 1) The Waste Management contract is currently being prepared to be put out for bids. 2) The burnt out house on West Vine Street has been torn down by the city employees. 3) Delores Sanders the property owner of the West Vine house has been sent the quick claim deed on the property and her lawyer is reviewing the paper work. 4) The Turman house on Walnut Street has been demolished and will be hauled off as soon as the weather breaks. 5) All of the services on the light pole on the square have been moved and Gibson Electric will remove the light pole soon. Ferris Arnold suggested that the water meter is relocated to the back of the property instead of the steps on the corner of East Main and the court square. 6) There will be a Downtown grant meeting in January. 7) The building inspector condemned 3 properties in December. 8) All of the Department of Defense equipment is running good. 9) Mayor Emison along with Ed Hargrave has been exploring the possibility of abandoning the alarm system (maintenance and monitoring and phone system). 10) The planning commission and the board of Aldermen have received the mayor updates on the zoning. 11) The Town has been awarded a property conservation grant from Public Entity Partners for cameras. The grant amount is up to \$2000.00 and is a 50/50 grant. 12) Lionel Hughes informed the mayor that the town would receive \$2700.00 refund on

worker compensation premium from an audit. 13) The sewer machine hose was not covered under the manufacturer's warranty.

Alderman Conley made a motion to adopt the minutes of the December 2019 meeting and Alderman Reddick seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted, Aye. The motion carried.

Alderman Conder made a motion to adjourn and Alderman Conley seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted, Aye. The motion carried and the meeting was adjourned.
